Fate, Destiny and Choice

Lecture by: Jeff Raff

In this lecture, Jeff Raff will differentiate between fate and destiny. He will discuss fate as the force that appears outside of ourselves, often impersonal, but with such power that it dominates our lives leaving us little choice but acceptance or resistance. Destiny, on the other hand, he sees as the drive that pushes us to become ourselves and to embrace our own totality as a way of being. Unlike fate, destiny compels us to honor our nature and find ways of expressing it in life. Choice is essential to realize our destiny, but our choices are limited by the very nature we are trying to express. Jeff will discuss the ways in which we can make informed, conscious choices that allow our destiny to express itself, as well as the barriers to making these choices.

Cosmic Affinities: Finding Meaning in Today's Technological World

Late in life Jung stated that we “cannot stand a meaningless life.” Where do we find meaning in today’s world of technological speed and parallel processing? In past times a sense of meaning arose from the belief in a mirroring connection between the individual and the cosmos. Over time our sense of being in the world has shifted from one of *cosmic affinity* to one in which we may feel alone within a vast, infinite cosmos. In this presentation I explore how our sense of being in the world evolved through the ages and the psychological implications of this shift. Using images and Jungian concepts we will explore our very being in the world and how Jungian psychology offers a comprehensive path to creating a more sacred meaningful sense of being in the world.

Jeffrey Kiehl, Ph.D., M.A., LPC is a Diplomate Jungian Analyst with a private practice in Boulder, Colorado. He is Vice-President of the C.G. Jung Institute of Colorado, a member of the Inter-Regional Society of Jungian Analysts, and the International Association for Analytical

Psychology. Over the past fifteen years, Jeffrey has lectured and given workshops both nationally and internationally on topics including: Jungian ecopsychology, film interpretation and alchemy.

The poet Novalis once said, “Every illness is a musical problem and every cure has a musical solution.” The power of music to tame the wildest passions, cure physical illness and penetrate to the deepest parts of the psyche is well documented by mythology and the philosophies of the ancient world. In this lecture, we will explore the power of music to harmonize both body and soul and bring them into relationship with what C. G. Jung calls the organizing principle of the personality, the Self. Jung has said that music “...reaches the deep archetypal material that we can only sometimes reach in our analytical work with patients. I feel that from now on music should be a part of every analysis.” We will show a short film clip to demonstrate how music and its power to harmonize the instinctual and spiritual realms can be a healing force.

C. G. Jung described active imagination as the only way to achieve a direct encounter with the unconscious without the use of tests or dream interpretation. Marie Louise von Franz described active imagination as “the most powerful tool in Jungian psychology for achieving wholeness—far more than dream interpretation alone.” In this workshop, we will demonstrate how the universal language of music can stimulate the imagination, operate as a guide into the deepest parts of our psyche, and lead beyond cognitive awareness and into a direct connection to the emotions, which Jung declares to be the chief source of consciousness. We will also discuss and demonstrate with short pieces of classical and modern music, how music can function as a bridge between consciousness and the unconscious, reflecting Jung’s important idea of the transcendent function and the importance he placed on the technique of active imagination. **Call (719) 527-0622 for a reservation.
