A Community Reflection: What Are the Archetypal Themes Arising in Our Country's Current Events?

For this evening's gathering, the C.G. Jung Society will offer an opportunity for attendees to reflect and dialogue on archetypal themes arising in our lives as a result of recent sociopolitical events. The discussion will focus especially on the images and symbols that have arisen in the dreams and imaginations of those present. Together, we will explore ways in which a Jungian perspective may inform and encourage constructive attitudes and approaches to some of the sociopolitical challenges we're currently facing.

The *Archetype of the Apocalypse*, a psycho-spiritual experience of the end of the world as we know it, happens both in the psyche of individuals and in our collective world today. The Archetypal Heavens ***By Michele DesLauriers***

In the psyche, the masculine and feminine principles complement and balance one another. We find these universal principles symbolized in the planets of our solar system. Each planet carries archetypal meanings both in the outer world and in the inner world of meaning. For this presentation Michele will explore, using image and myth, the masculine and feminine polarities found in the two great lights of the heavens, the Sun and the Moon, and in the planets Venus and Mars.

Michele DesLauriers was introduced to the work of Carl Jung in 1980 at the Center for Sacred Psychology in Los Angeles, where she also served on staff as a spiritual director. Friday Lecture • May 12, 2017, 7-9 pm

The Annunciation: Transcendence Expressed Through Art from the Renaissance

By Kathryn Kuisle, Ph.D.

In this lecture, Dr. Kuisle will explore the symbolism and depth of meaning in the long-ago story of the Annunciation. The story – wherein the angel, Gabriel, appeared to Mary, the Virgin, and gave her a startling message – conveys an image that resonates with us still. The paintings we'll be viewing were created by a variety of artists from the Renaissance period. Each one expresses a unique interpretation of this archetypal event. Kathryn will reflect on how these artists attempted to express “transcendence” in a portrayal of the moment of “the annunciation.” Carl Jung described this moment as symbolizing an experience “*that grips us or falls upon us as from above*”, an experience that is possible in our own psychological development. Kathryn will elaborate on Jung’s contributions to depth psychology, emphasizing his work on the subject of transcendence and “the transcendent function.”



Kathryn Kuisle, Ph.D., is a graduate of the C. G. Jung Institute in Zurich and Union Institute and University in Cincinnati, is currently president of the Jung Society of Colorado Springs and a Jungian analyst with a private practice in Colorado Springs and Denver. She also teaches at the C. G. Jung Institute of Colorado in Denver and at Regis University in the Masters in Counseling Program. Her website is www.kkuisle.com.
