### Jung Society Community Roundtable

#### Empowerment in a Time of Perceived Powerlessness

Thursday, September 6, 2018 - 6:30-8:30 pm

“Empowerment comes from understanding the widest spectrum of possibilities for embracing power.” James Hillman, *Kinds of Power*

Chris Hedges taught Victor Hugo’s *Les Miserables* to inmates at a prison in New Jersey; with Transformation understood as Empowerment, he summarized for inmates key lessons as follows:

“Transformation must be carried out not for what it will achieve, for often it will achieve nothing, or how it will be perceived, for most of the wider society will not perceive it. Transformation is about making peace with yourself. It is about obeying your conscience, which Hugo equates with the divine. It is about never living at the expense of another. Transformation is about rising above the hatred many feel, with justification, for a society that has betrayed them.” In seeking to restore and embrace a sense of our own empowerment:

How do we make peace with and within ourselves?

What does it mean to obey our conscience or our Higher Self?

How do we come to recognize our living “at the expense of others,” how can we cease to do so?

Who and what do we hate? Where does that quality that I can’t stand in the other, live in me?

How might we “rise above the hatred” for a society that we might feel has betrayed us?

## Imagination and Psychoidal Experience

Lecture by Jeffrey Raff

Thursday, October 11, 2018 6:30-8.30 pm

Twenty years ago, I had an experience of the Goddess Sophia, who came to my room to speak with me. I lost much of the experience as the memory faded but I gained much as well. As a result of this experience, as well as several others, I learned to distinguish the psychoid from other imaginal states. In this lecture I will share what I have learned, weaving together the discussion of my own experiences with my understanding of active imagination and the way in which it can open the door to the psychoid. Those interested in exploring their own imagination as well as those simply interested in the theory behind psychoidal experiences should find the lecture enlightening.

Jeffrey Raff studied at the C.G. Jung Institute in the early '70's, graduating in 1976. He has been in private practice in Denver since that time. He is the author of four books, including Jung and the Alchemical Imagination and The Wedding of Sophia, as well as several articles. He has lectured throughout the United States on such topics as alchemy and active imagination.

When a dream is forgotten, dismissed, ignored or called names ("worthless, a snippet, stupid, etc."), important information is lost. A discussion with clinical examples will explore what many miss: the quiet beginnings of consciousness evidenced in what is often overlooked. Alchemical parallels, cultural dreams, and elements of dreaming that are routinely misunderstood will be discussed as well.



Tess Castleman, Jungian Training Analyst, is the author of two volumes and numerous articles. Besides practicing in Dallas and Zurich, she leads groups in dream circles, writing seminars, creative process experience as well as active imagination/dream retreats in locations throughout the world. She lives in Manitou Springs, CO and Dallas, Texas.
