Obstacles to Individuation: Challenges for Individuals Impacted by Fundamentalism

Lecture by Renae Cobb, M.S., L.P.C., Jungian Analyst


Individuation, the movement toward wholeness and development of the Self, is the ultimate focus of Analytical Psychology. The lifelong individuation process requires a shift of control away from ego consciousness toward psyche rooted in the unconscious realm. The fundamentalist paradigm presents obstacles to this process. Today's "spirit of the times," with its social, religious and political constructs leaning precariously toward fundamentalism, threatens rejection from a community that bases its survival on a rigid belief system. We will look at ways these obstacles might be overcome by challenging theoretical and theological constructs, learning how to think symbolically, and being willing to grapple with new and paradoxical ideas.

Renae Cobb is a Jungian Analyst in private practice in McKinney, Texas. She completed her training at the C.G. Jung Institute, Zurich, Switzerland. She specializes in work with clients dealing with issues around spirituality and spiritual abuse, life transitions, and trauma. Renae holds workshops and retreats focused on personal and spiritual growth and development.

Jung saw his psychological work as similar to that of the solitary alchemist, both striving to liberate spirit, a cyclical process in which the transformative experience of individuation comes to life. In this lecture, Lara Newton will present and explore the psychological dimensions of that alchemical process and some of the major operations from a depth psychological perspective, always recognizing that the container for this process is our human experience of the ever-evolving movement between matter and spirit. Throughout the presentation, dreams will be used to amplify and elucidate the alchemical images and process.

Gathering in the Prima Materia of Our Own Myth: Jung's Memories, Dreams, Reflections as a Model for Our Psychological Growth

When he was in his 80's, C.G. Jung sat down with Aniela Jaffe and began a series of reflections on the guiding dreams, memories, and meditations of his lifetime. The result is both poignant and profound, and by considering his life from such an introverted perspective, he re-defined "autobiography" as the narrative of one's inner psychic life. We will use his work as a model to begin gathering in our own "memories, dreams, reflections" as the *prima materia*, the 'living stones" of our own psychic myth, and explore the meaning of individuation. This talk will also serve as an introduction to a longer process of journaling one's personal myth in a small group format.

Alan Drymala is an analyst in training at the Centre for Depth Psychology according to C.G. Jung and Marie-Louise von Franz in Zurich, Switzerland. He has a passion for bringing the wisdom tradition of Jung to the world through analysis, dream groups, and Jungian reading groups.
