Liber Primus - The Way of What is to Come

Lecture by Alan Drymala, LPC

Jung's profound confrontation with the unconscious in 1913-1917, recorded in his illustrated manuscript of the *Red Book*, formed the basis for all his future work in depth psychology.

"The years when I was pursuing my inner images were the most important in my life - in them everything essential was decided. It all began then; the later details are only supplements and clarifications of the material that burst forth from the unconscious and at first swamped me. It was the *prima materia* for a lifetime's work." *Memories, Dreams, Reflections*, p. 199


With the proviso that I am not a Jungian scholar nor a *Red Book* specialist, but rather a serious analyst and student of Jung, I would like to bring a study of Jung's *Red Book* into our reflection process here at the Colorado Springs Jung Society.

To begin that meditation, I would like to offer as our opening lecture in February 2023 a presentation on the first portion of the *Red Book*, the *Liber Primus - The Way of What is to Come*.

In preparation for the February talk, I would like to invite everyone who has a copy to go back to the *Red Book* and read Sonu Shamdasani's "Introduction" and then the translation of the first section, the *Liber Primus*. Many of you would know these accounts of Jung's first attempts at active imagination, leading him to encounter his depths and engage figures such as Siegfried, the

Germanic culture hero, and ultimately Elijah and Salome, whom he came to understand as the "wise old man" (forethinking) and his soul (pleasure).

Picture Interpretation of Jung's Systema Munditotius

Lecture by Christine Chapman, M. Psych Clin

Do you ever find yourself looking at a picture (be it from your own journal, an alchemical picture, or even one of Jung's mandalas) and wondering what it actually means? Picture interpretation, similar to dream interpretation, follows a set of organized steps through which we can analyse the psychic contents of this visual medium.

Jung's mandala, *Systema munditotius*, appears in the Red Book on page 364 in Appendix A. He created it in response to material which erupted from his psyche in 1914 which he wrote up in *The Seven Sermons of the Dead*. It is a complex mandala which conveys tremendously important psychic insights into the emerging new myth of modern man, and provides fascinating material for us to explore the steps of picture interpretation as well as coming to understand some of the psychic patterns conveyed in this mandala.

Emotion and Individuation

Lecture by Judith Slimmon

With the advent of the Enlightenment and the Cartesian assertion, “I think, therefore I am,” has evolved a generalized mistrust of emotional life. This lecture will explore the vital role of emotion in the journey of individuation – focusing on the instinctual survival emotions. The lecture begins with a brief synopsis of the assigned role and importance of emotion throughout history,

Judith will then look at Carl Jung’s research and writing on emotion, including the association experiment, complex theory and archetypal and instinctual energies. The remainder of the lecture will focus on the six survival emotions – fear, anger, disgust, surprise, sorrow and joy, describing each in more detail and their role in consciously becoming oneself.

Judith Slimmon is a Jungian Analyst who graduated from the C.G. Jung Institute in Zurich in 2001. She worked in private practice in Calgary, Alberta for the next 14 years. Judith has lectured across Canada and in Europe. She has also been part of the training faculty of the C.G. Jung Institute of Colorado. In 2015 Judith moved to beautiful Victoria where she maintains private practice and pursues her avocation as a painter and pianist.
