

The New Pope and the Animals

In the Grimm's fairytale, "The Three Languages," a father sends his son to be taught by three different masters, but the son learns only to understand the barking of dogs, the twittering of birds, and the croaking of frogs. In a rage, his father wants to have him killed, but the boy escapes and, because he can understand the language of dogs, he is able to retrieve a hidden treasure. Finally, with the help of two doves, he is chosen to succeed the pope, who has just died. These same doves provide him with the text of the Mass he should sing. Because he understands the language of frogs, in some European versions he is able to heal someone's daughter who is ill, while on his way to Rome.

For Gotthilf Isler, this new pope is the symbol of a new religious attitude that is being sought today in the unconscious of many individuals. It is an attitude that

has made peace with the animal world—that is, with the million-year-old knowledge of human nature that is manifest in both the instincts and archetypes of the collective unconscious.

Dr Gotthilf Isler (1930 – 2022) trained as a Jungian analyst at C. G. Jung Institute in Zurich and worked for many years with Dr. Marie-Louise von Franz. He studied folklore, European folk literature, and the history of religion in Zurich. He was a founding member and past president, for 10 years, of the Research and Training Centre for Depth Psychology according to C. G. Jung and Marie-Louise von Franz. Godi died just four days shy of his 92rd birthday on Dec 1, 2022.

The King Archetype: Approaching Sacred Centeredness in an Age of Extremes

Lecture by Ōmid Dastán Harrison

Paralleling historical developments that brought about the end of the Kingship as the chief model of political office during the Revolutions which followed the 18th century European Enlightenment, the emerging Modern notions of the rise of the Rational State lead to the subsequent de-mystification of The Sacred in the West. Once tied to covenantal mediations between the Divine and the Human, the Sacral King was the universally accepted norm for thousands of years as the central representational model of Cosmic Order – both righteous and brutal; both good and bad – which lead to the collective evolution of our consciousness. Now under the pressures of centuries' worth of intense scrutiny and suspicion, the King has suffered the fallout of the mythological stripping that comes with a profound fall from grace – and perhaps deservedly so. Still, as modern humanity continues to enjoy its newfound situation, replete with secular



political reform, incumbent material prosperity, and a razor-sharp intellect that produces extraordinary scientific advancement, it's also likewise begun to struggle adjusting to an unsuspecting ghost from the unconscious which has deigned in recent times to rear its ugly head with the prospect of facing a hauntingly uncomfortable truth: that the birth of Modernity has been bought with the terrifying cost of the loss of spirit and soul.

In this presentation, we will be drawing primarily from Robert Moore and Douglas Gilette's works surrounding their titular *King, Warrior, Magician, Lover* series, as well as other important Jungian Analysts dealing particularly with Masculine Psychology. Our conclusion will not argue for a return to the Monarchy as a political form of government; instead, our response to the horrors that our previous century's Age of Nihilism brought about, followed by today's modern crisis of consciousness, will encourage us to re-discover the original intention that the impulse towards democracy affords us: that the incorporation, and not the abnegation, of the King Archetype within each individual, is sacrosanct.

Ōmid Dastán Harrison, B.A., is a graduate of the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs and works currently as a local actor of stage and screen. He is driven by an obsession inspired by Jung to incorporate the great psychological work into his artistic passions and help to distribute the visions of healing in the unconscious to audiences everywhere.
